### PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The program incorporates the following elements:

- a full University of Regina, M.Ed. degree in Curriculum and Instruction, focusing on leadership in the context of Aboriginal Education;
- a 30 credit hour program: 10 courses offered on-site over a 2+ year period;
- a cohort of students, forming a community of learners who are able to support each other in their learning;
- a flexible course delivery, including weekend sessions, summer institutes, and online distance education;
- the use of information technology to better support links between students and with instructors;
- content themes tailored to respond to community and student needs including: adult education, Aboriginal education; curriculum and instruction; and instructional technology;
- opportunities to engage in relevant applied research projects, utilizing current research methods to address contemporary educational issues in schools and communities; and
- a Program Coordinator to offer advice and support to students.
