Application Based Completion Scholarships

*All applicants must have submitted a scholarship application to North West College by March 14, 2025 to be considered.

Application-based completion scholarships are presented to full-time students (60% course load) completing a certificate, diploma or degree entirely through the North West College. A student may only receive each award once. Each award description will list any additional eligibility requirements. All eligible students who have applied to programs that conclude between July 1, 2024 and June 30, 2025 of the current academic year can apply for these awards.

Other terms and conditions may apply.

North West College reserves the right to make changes as deemed necessary, including cancellation of particular awards.

	<p>Battlefords Healthcare Foundation Scholarship \$500</p>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Open to Battlefords Campus students who are registered in a health related, full-time skills training program. • Applicants must submit an essay that demonstrates leadership and a commitment to remain in the community after training. • A letter of support from the program instructor must be submitted discussing the applicant’s class and college participation. • The recipient will not have received a Battlefords Healthcare Foundation Scholarship within the past two years.
	<p>Gordon Tucker Memorial Scholarship \$2500 x 2</p>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any status First Nations, Metis, or Inuit student enrolled, either full-time or part-time in a program leading to a certificate, diploma or degree. • Must submit an essay outlining community involvement, academic achievements (can include grade 12 accomplishments), and activities while in college/university. The 1500 word (max) essay should include general interests and activities, name of program, educational and career goals, how you plan to achieve these goals, and why you feel you should be selected to receive this award.
	<p>Registered Psychiatric Nursing Association of Saskatchewan Battleford Branch Scholarship \$1000 x 2</p>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students who successfully completed the Psychiatric Nursing Program at North West College; • Must demonstrate qualities of compassion, empathy and inclusiveness as observed by instructors, mentors or preceptors; and • Must demonstrate involvement in the community. • Provide a personal summary about yourself and your desire to become a Registered Psychiatric Nurse. Include examples of initiative and involvement in the community such as volunteer experience. Maximum of one page. • Provide two references: ideally an instructor, mentor and/or preceptor.

	<p>Twylia Wuttunee Memorial Scholarship \$2500 x 2</p>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A status First Nations, Metis or Inuit student, identifying as female, transgender, or non-binary and enrolled either full-time or part-time in a program leading to a certificate, diploma or degree. • Must submit an essay outlining community involvement, volunteer hours, academic achievements (can include grade 12 accomplishments), and activities while in college/university. The 1500 word (max) essay should include general interests and activities, name of program, educational and career goals, how you plan to achieve these goals, and why you feel you should be selected to receive this award.
	<p>Walker Wood Foundation Scholarship \$2000 x 2</p>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Open to all NWC students graduating from a Community Services program. • Two \$2000 scholarships will be awarded to two students. • Eligible students must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Not be funded (Does not include student loans). ○ Be a Canadian Citizen. ○ Be in good standing with the College. • Provide a letter of rationale, not exceeding 300 words, outlining why you should be considered for this award. The rationale should include financial need, career goals, community involvement and extracurricular activities.
	<p>Wanda Cox Memorial Scholarship \$500 x 1</p>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Open to Battlefords Campus students graduating from a Business or Trade program. • One \$500 scholarship will be awarded to one student. • Eligible students must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Have maintained an 80% average. ○ Completed a minimum of 20 hours of community volunteer service. ○ Preference will be given to applicants currently employed with Discovery Co-operative Ltd. • Provide a letter of rationale, not exceeding 300 words, outlining why you should be considered for this award.

Merit-Based Scholarships (application not required)

Merit-based completion scholarships are presented to full-time students (60% course load) who have successfully completed a North West College post-secondary program for the first time. A student may only receive this award once. Other terms and conditions may apply. North West College reserves the right to make changes as deemed necessary, including cancellation of particular awards. These Donor Scholarships are also merit-based scholarships and do not require an application form. The College will consider students in all eligible programs that ended between July 1 and June 30 of that academic year. No application required.

Battle River Treaty 6 Health Scholarship \$300

- Open to all NWC students who are successfully completing a program leading toward a career in a health-related field.
- One \$300 scholarship will be awarded to the student with the highest academic average.
- Priority will be given to a member of Battle River Treaty 6 Health member First Nations – Little Pine, Lucky Man, Poundmaker and Sweetgrass.
- Please indicate which First Nation you are a member of.

Future Foreman Scholarship \$200 x2

- Open to Meadow Lake Campus students who successfully graduate from a Welding program, and exemplify leadership skills to excel in the trade.

Jason Vany Scholarship \$1000

- Open to all NWC students who successfully completed a program at North West College.
- A North West College employee must nominate students.
- In keeping with the spirit of the late Jason Vany, nominees must exemplify the characteristics of quiet leadership, integrity, adaptability, compassion, humor and dedication.

Pat Bacon Memorial Scholarship \$300

- Open to Meadow Lake Campus students who, through perseverance successfully complete the Office Administration or Business program while facing adversity.

Presidents Achievement Scholarship

- Open to all NWC students who successfully graduate from an institute credit program from North West College.
- Students can be full-time or part-time.
- North West College institute credit instructors nominate a student based on the following criteria:
 - Student displays leadership within the classroom and college.
 - Student possesses the qualities and characteristics of a respectable citizen.
 - Student must be in good financial standing.
- No application required.

Scotiabank Scholarship \$1000 x 2

- Open to NWC students who successfully complete the Business Certificate program and the Business Management Diploma programs.
- Student must be full-time.
- Scholarships awarded based on top overall GPA in Business Certificate and Business Management Diploma programs.

Tolko Industries Ltd. Scholarship \$1000 x 2

- Open to Meadow Lake Campus students who successfully graduate from one of the following trades programs: Electrician, Carpentry, Heavy Equipment and Truck and Transport Technician, and Welding.
- Student must be full-time.
- Scholarship is awarded based on merit.
