Program Purpose

- **A Bachelor of Education Close to Home** - as this four-year Bachelor of Education Program is offered through the University of Regina and North West College, students can earn the degree close to home.
- **Local Delivery & Community Focus** - students can also train in and for their own communities, gaining culturally responsive, community-connected experience that prepares them to make a meaningful impact in local schools and communities.
- **Classroom-readiness** - prepares graduates to meet the requirements for Teacher Certification in Saskatchewan. Graduates are *eligible* to obtain a *Professional A Teacher's Certificate* from the **Saskatchewan Professional Teachers Regulatory Board (SPTRB)**.

 - ✓ **Final Year Internship:** Semester-long internship under daily supervision of cooperating teacher. Internship has become the flagship of the Faculty of Education

The Four-Year (eight-term) BEd Elementary Program requires 120 credit hours. The program consists of both academic courses taken outside the Faculty of Education as well as professional courses taken within.
